Outlines how William Connolly rose from a Catholic, relatively humble background, how he acquired very significant wealth, held many key political positions and patronised the architects who fashioned Georgian Dublin and Irish country houses. His life illustrates very well how the protestant ascendancy was consolidated, but also shows that the ascendancy was a complex phenomenon, that it was not a closed elite, and that it contained a strong strand of Irish patriotism, being much more than the instrument of British rule in Ireland.

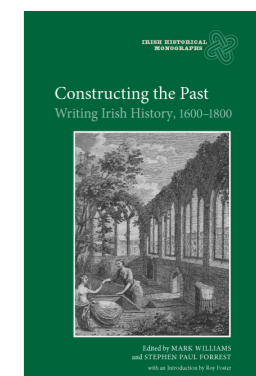
MARIE THERESE FLANAGAN

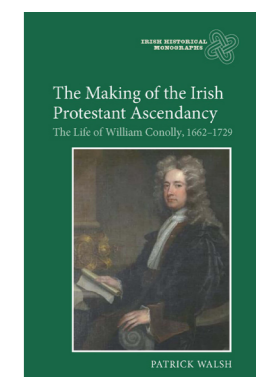

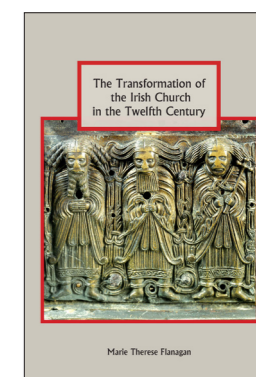

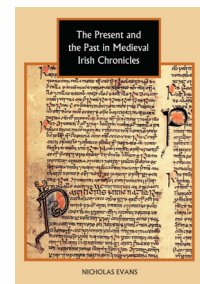

THE PRESENT AND THE PAST IN MEDIEVAL IRISH CHRONICLES

NICHOLAS EVANS



Analyses the principal Irish chronicles, especially the 'Annals of Ulster', 'Annals of Tigernach', and the *Chronicum Scotorum*, identifying their inter-relationships, the main changes to the texts, and the centres where they were written in the tenth and eleventh centuries. The detailed study enables the author to argue that the chroniclers were in contact with each other, exchanging written notices of events, and that therefore the chronicle texts reflect the social connections of

the Irish ecclesiastical and secular elites.

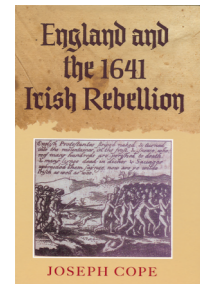
