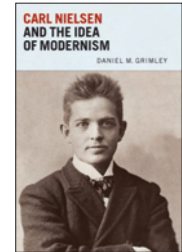

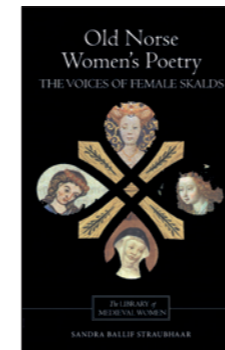

The poems reflect the dramatic and often violent nature of the sagas. Their authors fall into four main categories: pre-Christian Norwegian and Icelandic skáldkonur

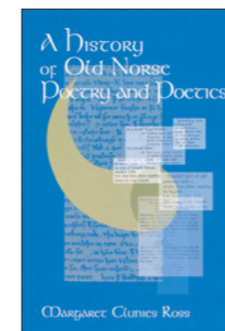
